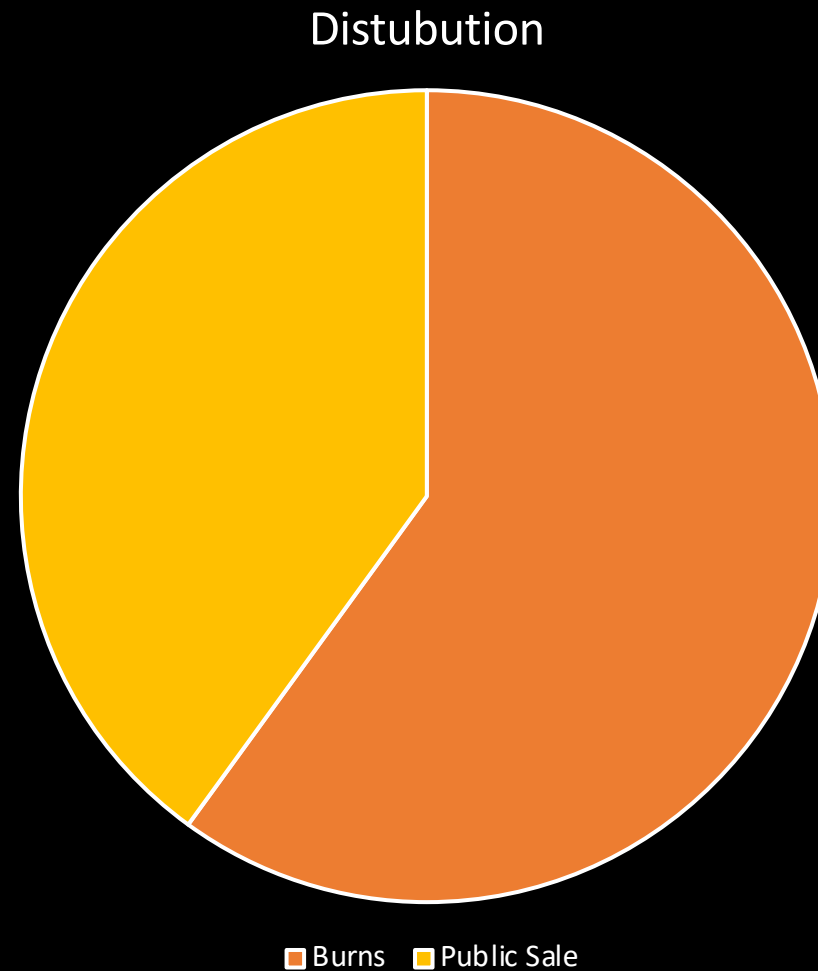

Remainder of tokens that have not been locked will be burned additionally.
